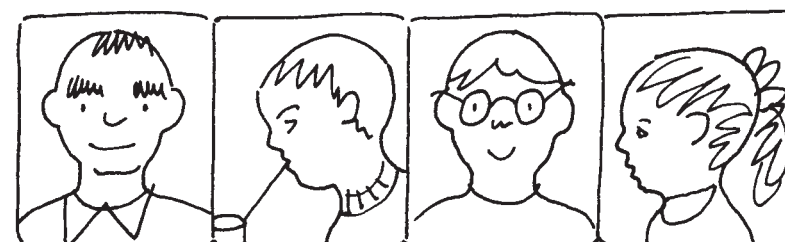


BUSHY EYEBROWS AND BIG CHAIRS

Then, add another category, such as "six-legged" and have them write as many words as possible which fit all three categories.
